Principals Report

It is hard to believe that we are passed the halfway mark of Term and with Year 6 camp, Faction Swimming and this week NAPLAN all items we have ticked off the term planner already. The majority of students have settled in positively into the routines and rigours of school. There have been a few of our students who have been a little bit unsettled especially when separating from their parents at the beginning of the day. Most of the time these little people settle positively after parents have left them, but we would always let you know if your child was too distressed during the day. There is an online program available called Fearless Triple P which focuses on strategies for managing your child's anxiety and I would highly recommend this to any families who feel that they are at a loss to manage these big feelings in their child.

Year 6 camp was a great success with 17 students and 4 staff from Mingenew and Walkaway attending last week. As you may be aware we changed the timing of the camp to take advantage of the Primary Dream and Lead Conference which was held at the Perth Convention Centre on Thursday 6th March. Our students joined 1000 other year 6 cohorts for a day of engaging guest speakers, interactive activities and some really thought provoking and entertaining presentations about how they can be an agent for change in their own communities. In Term 2 we will take an opportunity to further develop our student leaders by participating in a 10 week change project as a follow on from the conference. During the week students tested themselves on the high ropes course, canoeing games and water slides; as well as the challenges of being away from home, meeting new people, organising their belongings and sharing their.



personal space with others. Students from both schools were a credit to their families, schools and communities. A huge thank you to our P&C for the contribution that they make to ensure that camp is affordable for all families, which out this contribution the full cost per student would be out of reach for some of our families. Thanks also to Brenda Carter for coming on camp this year. The number of schools who are not offering a school camp anymore continues to grow and we are very lucky that we have staff who will support our students to attend.

NAPLAN starts this week for all students across Australia in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9. Our students have had an opportunity to participate in practice sessions to familiarise themselves with the online platform used to complete the assessments. We already use some online testing programs, including a program called Writemark for collecting writing samples so our students are mostly comfortable using a device to complete assessments.

Parent- Teacher meetings will be offered at the end of this term. Please make an effort to attend these meetings as they form a very important part of our reporting procedures here at Mingenew Primary School. A great deal of thought and

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organisation goes into the timing and scheduling of these meetings, and it is critical that teachers are allowed to stick to the time limits, so please respect the time of the teachers and other parents. If a longer meeting is required, this can be arranged for a later date and time that suits you and your child's teacher. At the meeting the teachers will use a set agenda that will cover your child's beginning of year assessment data in Literacy & Maths as well as some key points about their approach to learning and their wellbeing. If your child participates in an intervention program you will be provided with a slightly longer meeting so the intervention EA can provide you with information about their progress in these programs.

As part of our whole school wellbeing strategy, we have planned an end of term community picnic, similar to the event we had at Mingenew Hill last year. We would like families to join us for a BYO picnic lunch and games at the Port Dennison Foreshore on Thursday 10th of April - details to follow.

On behalf of the staff, I would like to extend my thanks to all families for a smooth start to another school year. Our current school attendance is sitting at 93.7% which is a huge improvement on the same time last year (86.8%). This strong attendance is clearly making a difference to the progress that students have been making, with all classroom teachers reporting that they are making strong gains in classroom programs in comparison to the same time last year
